


# How to Respond to an Opioid Poisoning



**Responsiveness means:**

- Awake and alert **OR**
- Easy to wake up

**Breathing normally means:**

- Taking 12 or more breaths per minute **AND**
- No unusual breathing sounds (e.g. gurgling)

**If at any time:**

**There is NO PULSE:**  
Start CPR with rescue breathing and compressions

**They start breathing normally:**

- Place them on their side
- Do not leave them alone
- Keep monitoring them
- Repeat SAVE ME if their breathing changes
- **STOP** giving naloxone when they are breathing normally – even if they are still unresponsive
